


Not Just Space: **Place Makers**

Guiseppe Terragni (1904–1943) was a fascinating Italian architect who worked predominantly under the fascist regime of Mussolini. Pioneering the Italian modern movement in architecture, his work examined the relationship between abstract art and the architecture.

On the 4th June, Dr Anthony White, Lecturer in Art History at the University of Melbourne, will discuss Terragni in conjunction with Ian Friend: Works on Paper 1977–2007. 6–7pm at the Brisbane Art Museum.

Brisbane's GoMA is currently home to Gernika in Sand. A powerful project by New-York based artist, Lee Mingwei, created over a 10-day period. The moving interpretation channels Picasso's mural, depicting the massacre in Guernica, Spain, during the Spanish Civil War. While Picasso's work focused on the brutality of the massacre, Mingwei focuses on the cycles of destruction and creation. The powerful piece is created in sand allowing him to return midway through the display and alter the work forming a new piece. Until 6 July, Gallery 3.5.




The latest hot dining spot to hit the Tweed Coast is the Bamboo Restaurant + Lounge Bar, with an exotic interior and cuisine made from local produce.

Women Suffrage **Memorial Completed** steffen.lehmann@newcastle.edu.au


A small but extremely significant memorial project in Brisbane, the Women Suffrage Memorial, has come to completion.

The completed artwork by media artist Cida de Aragon in collaboration with architect, Steffen Lehmann, is located in close proximity to Brisbane City Hall and commemorates the centenary of women suffrage and is a reflective, quiet place where people may walk and sit in the shade. It is a permanent artwork visible from all sides and surrounded by high-rise buildings.

The project has just been selected to be exhibited at the forthcoming Architectural Biennale in Venice (September – November 2008), as part of the Australian exhibition.
