All workshops are \$12 payable to the tutor per week with all materials supplied.




Little Architects

Young Architects for Term One - Age 12 - 18 commences 11 Feb 2009

WEEK	FRAMEWORK	WORKSHOP
Architectural Principles		
week 1	Space and Scale	Learn how we design for space and scale using large folded cardboard forms. We explore buildings around the Lock-up with various scales and place ourselves into all sorts of spaces to see how we feel.
week 2	Architectural Representation (Drawing)	This class looks at drawing techniques used to bring design ideas to life! In this class we use the sculptural forms made in Week One to draw in plan, elevation and section.
week 3	Light Shadow Reflection	This week we take a variety of everyday found objects and spray paint them monotone to observe shadows on form. We then spotlight them in a dark room, photograph them and observe the printed images.
week 4	Gravity	In this class we look at the importance of engineering looking at several local bridges as case studies. We will construct models to investigate strength, material properties, compression and tension.
week 5	Anti Gravity	This class delves into the world of the fantastic. We take a fun look at space architecture, creating forms from balloons and feathers.
Architectural Exploration - observation based learning.		
week 6	Life Behind buildings	Using an image of an architectural fantasia by Will Sweeney, this class explores how we live in cities and the things we do in buildings and homes. We will take a walk around Newcastle identifying the transition of shops to cultural spaces with the Renew Newcastle project as case study. We will also look closely at one building with a range of uses.
week 7	Global City	In this class we look at the imagery of global cities in contrast to the village. We will look at village house typologies and create homes using a limited range of materials.
week 8	Planes, trains, ships and automobiles	This lesson will look at city transport networks. We will look closely at the rail debate in Newcastle and identify other areas of transport on road, air and harbour. Students will design a fun method of amphibian transport using drawing skills and pure imagination.
week 9	Embedded landscape	An investigation into how the landscape has formed and influenced the city lifestyle. We'll be taking a walk up to the Hill to draw and explore looking at natural and artificial landscapes.
School Holiday Workshop		
In this two-day workshop we will take on a hypothetical client to create a temporary installation in the public realm. As a group, the young architects will look at ideas of temporary architecture and produce a work together.
